We offer environmental education sessions that allow children to explore, discover and create with nature.

Shelter building or Minibeast hunting

Each session lasts 2 hours and can be run as an independent half day activity or combined together to make a full day of fun and adventure.

Alternatively you could mix an environmental activity with one of the half day multi- activity sessions that we offer (e.g. A morning of shelter building followed by an afternoon of archery and orienteering.

Location and site information

Coaches should drop you off on Adderstone Field and our staff will meet you there.

At our activity centre, 10 minutes walk from here, we have a large undercover decked area with picnic tables, toilets, and cafe which is available to use at lunch time.

Shelter-building

Shelter building is a fun activity which encourages children to work as a team in a natural environment.

Tree ID and natural art activities are used as an introduction on the way to our shelter building site – 500m walk from Adderstone field.

The walk also enables us to look at the forest and discuss the way the Forestry Commission care for Dalby- for people, wildlife and timber.

On arrival, the basics of materials needed and techniques required to build a good shelter are discussed before the children are split into small teams to construct their shelter.

On completion teams present their shelter to the rest of the group and the shelter is tested to see if it is waterproof.

Minibeast Hunting

Mini-beast hunting is a fun activity which encourages the children to explore and discover more about the world around them.

On the short walk from Adderstone Field we look at the forest habitat and discuss the way the Forestry Commission care for Dalby- for people, wildlife and timber.

After a short introduction the children hunt for minibeasts, giving them an opportunity to observe and identify them close up.

Following discussions about what creatures have been found and their adaptations, the session can be finished with natural art activities or fun minibeast related games.



The session can be linked to many aspects of the curriculum including science, numeracy and literacy, art or drama.
